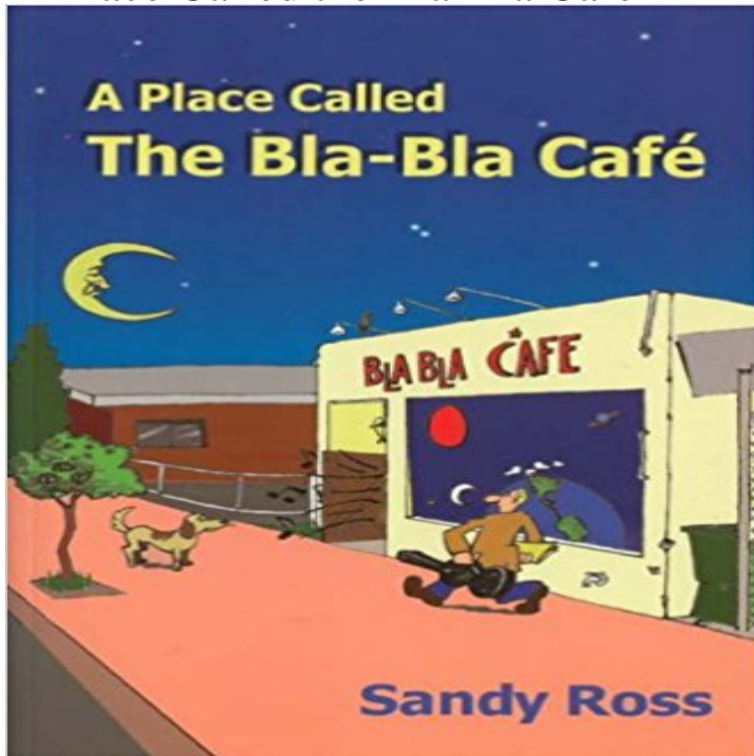


A Place Called the Bla-Bla Cafe



In 1971, songwriter Sandy Ross headed to Hollywood to make it in the entertainment industry. There she found the Bla-Bla Cafe, a hole-in-the-wall nightclub that developed into the thriving talent showcase where many of today's most famous celebrities got their start. Within the backdrop of the social and political consciousness of the 70s, Ross tells her story, the cafe's history, and then shares the microphone with other performers and staff to vividly capture their most treasured remembrances. Who performed at the Bla-Bla Cafe? About the author. . . Sandy Ross came to Hollywood to work as a staff songwriter in the early 1970s. During that decade she also co-booked the Bla-Bla Cafe talent with owner Albie Hora and worked as the Entertainment Director for the Los Angeles Performing Arts and Folklife Festival under Artistic Director Warren Christensen. Throughout the 1990s she wrote an interactive travelogue called, Notes from the Road, and posted its segments to Internet listserves as she toured the folk circuit nationally. Sandy

currently lives in Van Nuys, California where she works as an aerospace systems engineer. A Place Called the Bla-Bla Cafe is her first book.
