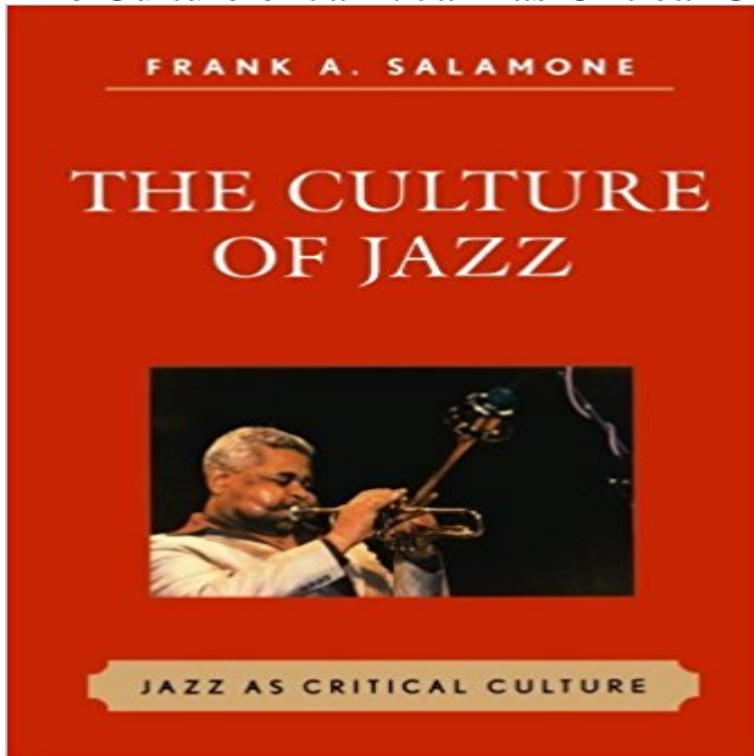


The Culture of Jazz: Jazz as Critical Culture
